OPENING THE SYSTEM

All System Controls will uniformly open the Systems. Each control will be guided by the following standard.

PREAMBLE

It is now _____Z, and time to begin the _____portion of the YL International SSBer's System. Any licensed amateur is welcome to participate with us, whether a member or not, but to earn system awards, you must be a paid up member.

We are using Netlogger as our primary logging tool. Netlogger download and assistance**, information concerning membership, and details of the YL System can be found at our website, www.ylssystem.org. If you do not have internet access, the control stations will furnish you with contact information*.

Keep control for 10 check-ins or **five** minutes, whichever comes first, then pass it on. If band conditions are bad or check-ins light, pass the control sooner to see if other control can pick any up.

When checking in or re-checking into the system, please give your call sign using phonetics.

This is: (Call Sign), My Name is: (Name)_____, Located in: (QTH), my sideband number is: (Sideband #)_. Co-Control(s) for this period will be (Co-Control(s) Call Sign), (Call Co-Control(s))

GUIDELINES FOR CONTROL STATIONS

First ask for DX, then Mobile and Low power stations. Then pass control to other control(s), and ask them to do the same. Then turn back to primary control station to ask for general check ins.

First time check-ins should be referred to the web site for information.

Encourage stations to use phonetics when checking in and re-checking on the system.

Keep control for 10 check-ins or five minutes, whichever comes first, then pass it on. If band conditions are bad or check-ins light, pass the control sooner to see if other control can pick any up.

Always ask for relays if you cannot hear.

Encourage other member stations to put out calls. This will not only increase participation and coverage, it will encourage stations to become involved as control stations which are always needed.

YL SYSTEM CLOSING STATEMENT

NOTE TO CONTROL STATIONS: *This statement is meant to be used when closing the system at the end of the day on 20 meters, or end of a session when no control will be continuing the system, i.e. weekend 20 meter sessions, end of 40, 80, 15 or 10 meter sessions.*

It is now Z, and time to close the YL ISSB System. We operate on this frequency (daily, week days, or day of the week), beginning at Z. Please visit our website at www.ylssystem.org for other operating frequencies and schedules. You will also find information about Netlogger, membership, and the history of the system.

We would like to thank all of the stations who checked into the system today, and also the control stations who make the system possible.

TO ALL SYSTEM CONTROLS

Required Reading

JET PROPELLED SYSTEMS

The thought that should be uppermost in the mind of SC's is to brilliantly execute a fast moving and efficient System. Nothing is more boring than a drab, slow-moving System. Systems should be warm and enthusiastic. The tone of voice of the Control reflects personal interest, or lack thereof, and an indifferent approach is immediately recognized and felt by all. DX members are SSB'ers strength, in that they not only represent glamour but also when they serve as SC's or assist SC, their appeal is evident by the increase of check-ins. They do excellent jobs in this capacity. DX are never to be neglected, and happily seldom are.

SSB'ers COMMISSION

is embodied in our Credo and Motto. Emergency traffic takes precedence over all else.

NEXT IN LINE

of importance is that we consider well the broad spectrum of world-wide public relations in keeping with our MOTTO. SC's are SSB'ers most active AMBASSADORS. They should be an inspiration. This is all part of being a System Control.

ALSO IN SUPPORT

of SSB'ers desire for building world-wide friendship (with our Torch of Friendship) and service to mankind, every effort has been exercised to avail SSB'ers of the world's most outstanding Awards Program, certainly the most unique.

SC's

In order to stimulate our awards program, please call attention to YL/OM teams, DX, Emeritus Council members, TFO holders, Devotional persons, etc., who are on frequency. This will alert those members who are working for certain awards.

CONDUCT YOUR SYSTEM

with dignity and warmth, friendliness and charm, courtesy and fairness, with never a hint of selfishness, such as garnering unto yourself as many signal reports as possible while running the systems, or any other manifestation of being SC for your own need. If a station requests your signal report, by all means give it. Otherwise, reserve your contact hunting for when you are not functioning as System Control. This is Public Relations. Though it is less dramatic than saving a life, or other forms of emergency traffic, it is never-the-less an indication of YOUR interest in your organization, and a barometer of YOUR interest in the individual.

IDENTIFICATION

Do not make a fetish of it, but every 20 minutes or so, announce it as the YLISSB System, and listen for a moment which just might be sufficient for an emergency call to be heard.

REMEMBER

An ill-advised word, once spoken, can never be recalled.

SYSTEM INFORMATION - MEMBERSHIP

1. Membership in the YLISSB is open to all amateurs with a valid Amateur Radio license, upon application to the Treasurer with payment of current year's dues.
2. Members with current dues shall have the privilege of participating in all organizational activities, receive the monthly Communicator, and participate in awards and recognition (except those that require a minimum period of membership). Unpaid members may not participate in any of the organizational programs, awards or recognition. Unpaid members will not receive the monthly Communicator. Unpaid members will not have access to the full website.
3. Membership numbers are issued for life. If a member opts not to pay his or her dues, the number is still valid.
4. Club Stations may apply for membership in the YLISSB upon application to the Treasurer with payment of current year's dues.
 - A. Club stations will be issued a number in the same manner as any other member. Thus, no Club Station will be issued a special number. K4ICA, with the YLISSB number of #1, and KL7FH #9438 are Memorial Call Signs, and thus an exception to the rule.
 - B. Contacts made with a Club Station that has a YLISSB Number will count towards awards, even if the operator at the time is not a YLISSB member. However, any such operator may only use the Club number when operating on the YL System.
 - C. A form with Suggested Operating Procedures will be made available for all Club Stations, along with the request that the form be prominently displayed for use by any of their operators.
5. YL/OM TEAMS: A husband and wife residing in the same household may join the YLISSB as a YL/OM team. They must both hold valid Amateur licenses. Their dues will be that of a single member's dues, and only one copy of the Voice will be issued to the team. A YL/OM team may also consist of father/daughter or mother/son, sister/brother, but they must reside in the same residence.
6. Family Memberships: The Family Membership consists of any family member that holds a valid Amateur license. All family members may join for the price of one membership, regardless of whether or not they reside in the same residence. However, only one copy of the Voice will be sent to the family. If multiple copies of the Voice are desired, the Family Member must pay current dues to the YLISSB Treasurer, and a copy will be made available.

EMERGENCIES

A Brief Outline of What to Do

AN EMERGENCY BREAKS!

The System stands by.

To be prepared for any eventuality, you should have, among other things, the telephone number of your nearest Coast Guard, Highway Patrol, and main Airline. You may need to call airline for information on schedules that could transport to the destination the medicine or whatever supplies are required.

STATESIDE EMERGENCIES

Stateside emergencies present fewer problems than DX due to the proximity to metropolitan areas and public service established with the U.S. This provides almost instant assistance. The call for corneal transplants, blood, and whatever else, can normally be provided within an hour.

MARITIME EMERGENCIES

First you obtain from the vessel in Distress:

- Operator's call
- Name of vessel
- Longitude and latitude
- Lifeboats and flares aboard.

Then telephone the Coast Guard SEA-AIR RESCUE nearest the vessel. Also, inquire if medical assistance is required.

Naturally, each emergency will be slightly different. In any event, always get the proper info, alert the Coast Guard, and stand by until you are sure the Coast Guard is on the way to help.

DX DELIVERY PROBLEMS

The most EXACTING are calls from DX for immediate delivery of medication, blood serum, etc., for a life hanging in the balance, or vital medical equipment unavailable at their location needed to perform a surgical procedure. Get the following information:

- Name of the Doctor
- Name of the patient
- Name of medication (spelled phonetically)
- Name and/or location of nearest Airport
- If someone will be there to receive the items

Request the DX station to stay on frequency until further information is verified and/or given. Contact a Doctor or Pharmacist, preferably in a location/city nearest the country that the items will be shipped, or locally, get their name and ask if these things are available. **IF IT IS WHOLE BLOOD** or blood serum, a hospital will prepare it for packaging. Get the schedule for the first flight out to this destination area, and notify the DX station of the progress. In the event that the recipient is unable to cover or bear the expense, simply send the bill to the SSB'ers.

HIGHWAY EMERGENCIES

Notify the Highway Patrol/State Trooper dispatch of the accident with a good description of the location (i.e.; mile marker #, landmark, exit #, etc.) and if medical or ambulance assistance is required. When message traffic is prolonged and time lapses during the actual progress, notify the System to carry on, but listen for possible breaks.

IT IS IMPORTANT

that you do **NOT** clutter the System frequency with extraneous remarks or interruption unless you have VITAL information. SC will request assistance if needed...otherwise please stand by in the event you ARE needed.

SYSTEM CONTROL REPORT

Should be filled out by the SC and sent to the SSB's President. Outline what happened, who was contacted for help or for the actual item requested, and any other pertinent information that took place during the emergency. Be sure to include the date, time, etc.

REMEMBER

Everyone, always be alert for emergencies. They will probably be weak signals and could come from any direction and region of the world. Be helpful when asked, otherwise exercise good operator skills by Listening, only. While it is tempting to jump in and help, it may add to a chaotic confusion and undermine the progress of the System as well as the progress of handling the emergency.



2020 YLISSB CONVENTION
GENERAL MEETING & REPORTS
(Via Zoom.com)

The General Meeting was called to order by President Rose Rybachek (KL7FQQ) at 2:00 pm (EDT) on June 13, 2020. Rose welcomed everyone and encouraged them to consider coming to the Wisconsin Dells convention in 2021.

Invocation: The invocation was given by Rev. Jim (WA0PFV).

Roll Call of attendees: Larry Kaplan (AB3TY) performed the roll call of attendees. Each of the attendees were asked to provide their name, YLISSB System #, and their QTH. A total of 65 members attended this meeting. A copy of the attendees is attached to this report.

2019 minutes: Rose (KL7FQQ) indicated that the 2019 minutes was distributed and asked Bruce Tisdale (K9ICP), Secretary, to explain his role. Rose asked if there were any questions or corrections regarding the minutes. There being none, Larry (AB3TY) **moved** for approval of the 2019 minutes, Nancy Yoshida (K0YL) **seconded**, motion **passed**.

Financial reports: Bill Phillips (W7AJP), Treasurer, stated that his report was for the period May 2019 through the end of April 2020. Bill reviewed every line item on the Treasurer's and Net Worth reports. Bill (W7AJP) **moved** for acceptance of the Annual Treasurer's reports, **seconded** by Jim Flowers (VA7JSF), motion **passed**. Bill (W7AJP) next reviewed the budget for 2021. He noted that we are doing well. Bill (W7AJP) pointed out that the budget is always an estimate. There is a projected increase next year from membership dues. He also noted the significant increase in scholarships over last year was due to lower than anticipated scholarship requests granted this year. Bill (W7AJP) **moved** for acceptance of the budget, **seconded** by Nancy (K0YL), motion **passed**. Bill (W7AJP) added that we had money coming in for this convention and expense for Zoom. Bill (W7AJP) **moved** that if there is a money balance left after expenses are paid that it be put into the scholarship fund, **seconded** by Bobbie, motion **passed**.

Officer's Report: (President) Rose briefly reviewed the President's report. Bobbie Livingston (K4ZGH) **moved** for its acceptance, **seconded** by Jim Flower (VA7JSF), motion **passed**.

Committee and other reports: The chairs of each of the following committees introduced themselves and briefly summarized their report. These were as follows:

Ambassador Report – Bob Franson (KD0USN); Awards Report – Elsie/Lynn Janes (N0ESJ/N0PMQ); Chaplains – Jim McChesney(WA0PFV)/Bill Phillips(W7AJP); Condolence – Jim Pandzik (KE9PK); Editors – Jim Pandzik (KE9PK); Voice – Larry Kaplan (AB3TY); E-Mail & Telecommunication – Larry Kaplan (AB3TY); Facebook – Elsie Janes (N0ESJ); Historian – Bruce Tisdale (K9ICP); Information Officer – Bob Percefull (NC4RP); Net Logger – Bob Percefull (NC4RP); New Member Certificate – Jim Flowers (VA7JSF); Public Relations – Scotty Butler (K6ZNL); Scholarship – Bob Percefull (NC4RP). A question was asked earlier by Ben Booth (W4CT) regarding who qualifies for scholarship. Bob responded to this question; System Coordinators – Larry Kaplan (AB3TY); Sunrise – Gale Moody (KK4DYI); 1st Period – Art Dunn (W7TOA); 2nd Period – Al Watts (AF5VH); 3rd period – Jim (KM4TTT); Moon Beam - Larry Kaplan (AB3TY); 10, 15/17, 40,

80 meter sessions – Jon Lax (K2LAX); Veterans – Greg Aaron (N3MAV); Web Page – No report. A question was raised by Larry Morgan (AG5Z) regarding the definition of “Active” membership as reported in the information report given by Bob NC4RP. Following some discussion, it was agreed to amend this report by deleting the term “active” and in its place state 538 paid members. There being no other questions/comments regarding the reports, Dennis Cornell (KL7HRO) **moved** for the acceptance of all reports with the aforementioned amendment, **seconded** by John Calhoun (KC2ATK), motion **passed**.

Door Prize Drawings for (2) free membership: A random drawing of the member attendees resulted in the announced winners: #44 – Ron Smith (VE9GU) and Art Dunn (W7TOA). Bill (W7AJP) will send confirmations to the winners.

Old Business:

Report of nominating committee for 2021 election plus nominations from the floor: Nancy Yoshida (K0YL) reported nomination of the following individuals: Treasurer – Bob Percefull (NC4RP); Assistant Treasurer – Jim Johnston (KN4QKS); and Board - Larry Kaplan (AB3TY). There being no further nominations from the floor, Rose (KL7FQQ) closed nominations, Gale Moody (KK4DYI) **moved** for acceptance of the nominations, **seconded** by Jim Flower (VA7JSF), Motion **passed**.

Scholarship number and amount for 2021: Following some discussion of who qualifies and the challenges of obtaining scholarship candidates, it was **moved** by Nancy Yoshida (K0YL) that we offer five scholarships of \$2,000 each in 2021, **seconded** by Bobbie Livingston (K4ZGH), motion **passed**.

New Business:

Election of nominating committee 2022: Positions subject to nomination will be: President, Vice President, Secretary, and one Board member. The following individuals agreed to be on the nominating committee: John Calhoun (KC2ATK), Bob Percefull (NC4RP), Bob Franson (KD0USN), Bill Granger - (KL7WG) and Larry Kaplan (AB3TY). Larry will serve as chair. Nancy (K0YL) **moved** to accept this group for the nominating committee, **seconded** by Jim Flowers (VA7JSF), Motion **passed**.

Proposed Bylaw changes: Rose (KL7FQQ) asked for questions/comments regarding the proposed Bylaw changes distributed. Rick Bottle (W0UXO) questioned the substitution of “may” for “shall” in article #12. His concern related to proper controls on the money. Rose (KL7FQQ) explained the difficulty with banks and charges. Bill Granger (KL7WG) asked approximately how much money is collected for a convention. Rose (KL7FQQ) responded that it could vary up to as much as \$2,000. Bill Phillips (W7AJP) added that it was difficult for the Treasurer to handle these expenditures remotely. The convention chair provides a report of income and expense to him as Treasurer. Several alternative ideas were offered regarding the handling of these monies. Ultimately it was agreed and **moved** by Gale Moody (KK4DYI) to delete this section from the proposal, Nancy Yoshida (K0YL) **seconded**, motion **passed**. There being no further comments regarding the other proposed bylaw changes, Nancy Yoshida (K0YL) **moved** for approval, **seconded** by Dennis Cornell (KL7HRO), motion **passed**.

Future distribution method of Voice: Larry Kaplan (AB3TY) explained that in the past, the Voice was made available by PDF, CD, and hard copy print. He indicated CDs were no longer made available and hard copies mailings were labor intensive and costly. He had proposed that going forward with only PDF copies. Larry (AB3TY) reviewed the considerable labor involved and cost of printing. There was concern expressed regarding shifting the printing cost to members. Larry (AB3TY) suggested that the compromise might be to only send PDF to new members. No decision was reached.

Other: No further business requested.

2020 YLISSB CONVENTION WORKSHOP MINUTES

(Via Zoom.com)

The YLISSB Convention workshop was held via Zoom.com on Saturday, June 13, 2020. Approximately 64 members were present for the meeting (attendance list attached).

President Rose Rybachek (KL7FQQ) welcomed everyone at 11:15 EDT and requested Larry Kaplan (AB3TY) to do brief review of using Zoom followed by a roll call of attendees. Following completion of the roll call the meeting chair was turned over to Vice President Gloria Wells (K4DXM). An agenda of the following discussion items was reviewed and discussed:

- 1) **How can we get our club station, K4ICA, more active?** Gloria (K4DXM) explained the origins and past use of K4ICA. Gloria asked Bruce Tisdale (K9ICP) for a suggestion he wanted to offer. Bruce indicated that it might be good to run a K4ICA special event station on a quarterly or bi-annual basis to promote YLISSB in general. Gloria (K4DXM) suggested doing the regular special K4ICA day again as done in the past. Rose (KL7FQQ) agreed with starting the special days again. Paige (W0FLZ) suggested trying a digital QSO party using K4ICA because propagation is poor. Rachid Karro (3B8FP) reported that propagation within the Indian Ocean area is currently poor. Nancy (K0YL) indicated her willingness to try FT8. Nancy (K0YL) also mentioned use of fusion (C4FM) as another option for use of K4ICA. Larry (AB3TY) reminded everyone that we currently have a DMR channel every Wednesday and it hasn't been supported.
- 2) **How can we stimulate the awards program?** Elsie Janes (N0ESJ) stated that participation for awards has declined. As the Awards Coordinator she had thought about adding special awards for frequent participation in the awards program. Gloria (K4DXM) asked if Steven (VE3JPJ) could comment. Steven had nothing to add. Jim Flowers (VA7JSF) reminded everyone of the Pegasus Award which has been seldom given out. Elsie (N0ESJ) and Lynn (N0PMQ) have been looking at some new award categories.

Bruce Tisdale suggested doing a progressive award for achieving a certain number of monthly award certificates during the year (i.e., 5 months = YLISSB name tag; 7 months = YLISSB hat; 9 months = free membership). John Carlson (K0HD) suggested offering an award for working all YLs.

- 3) How can we get more YL's active? Goal, one YL Control per period. Gloria (K4DMX) mentioned from her experience YLs are afraid they will make mistakes or look foolish (mic fright). We need to get more YLs active. Fred Duke (K0CE) suggested one-year free membership for guest YLs checking in for the first time. It was noted by several participants that everyone is afraid when they first get started. Bruce Tisdale (K9ICP) suggested a YL to YL mentoring/Elmer program. Jim Pandzik (KE9PK) suggested support of scout merit programs to encourage young YLs into the hobby. Nancy Yoshida (K0YL) pointed out that there was a fair number of YLs currently at this convention. She encouraged them to pursue trying to becoming a control operator. Scotty Butler (K6ZNL) also supported YL to YL mentoring.
- 4) Question and answer period. John Moore (KB1CSI) indicated that he frequently has a problem getting on the System from New Hampshire. It was pointed out that this is a propagation issue and not something we can fix. Bruce (K9ICP) suggested maybe John KB1CSI could use remote operation as an alternative. Art (W7TOA) pointed out that we need to train people in use of Net logger before dropping YLs into control operations. Scotty (K6ZNL) asked where our Net logs go after they are used. Larry (AB3TY) replied that they are on the Net logger server for a period of time (3 months). Judy Nureberg (KC7KPG) indicated that in the past she and other YLs were asked by Jda to make calls as a way of becoming more experienced. John (KB1CSI) asked how he would get a listing of members. Nancy Yoshida (K0YL) noted that all member names are in the Voice or monthly Communicator. Bruce Tisdale (K9ICP) expressed that we need to spend a little more time with new guests checking-in to personally welcome them. Art Dunn (W7TOA) that good information is on the website and that controls needed to keep the System moving. Al Watts (AF5VH) commented that the TFO program was not working well. He suggested that a coordinating committee might be able to provide more focus. The board will be discussing at its meeting on Sunday. Jim (VA7JSF) mention that we use to send follow-up letters to guest that checked-in. Ron Ackers (W8BF) indicated that he has been invited to speak about the YLISSB at his local club meeting. Others might be able to do the same. Alan (KX7KX) asked if other members might be able to use the club call (K4ICA). Rose (KL7FQQ) indicated that individuals were permitted to use the club call with prior permission from the President or Treasurer. Jim (WA0PFV) noted that we needed to network with others about the YLISSB.

their staff to not be employed. These are serious stressors and when a Chaplain knows, he can and often does try to offer a comfort.

Not all members may appreciate a Chaplain, feeling they are not their religion. Unashamedly, I am a retired Baptist Pastor and Missionary. But I recall when I was appointed Chaplain to the Police Department in Kennewick, WA. The Chief of Police asked would I give last rites to a Catholic. I told him I would do my best to "put a Catholic on hold, and immediately call his Priest!" He laughed and said, "I just wondered, for I am a Catholic!" We soon enlisted a Catholic Priest to be one of our Chaplains. In God's service, HE who loves us most is not as sectarian as we humans have become.

As your chaplain, let me know where I can be of service. It might just be joining you in prayer for your neighbors. We have Chaplains because we care!

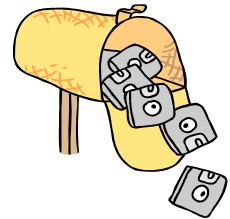

Compiling *The Voice* is a monumental endeavor unappreciated by those who only encounter Microsoft *Word* when typing the occasional letter. For the uninitiated, *Word* must have been designed by the Devil himself. When one looks at *The Voice*, those columns of call signs look marvelously formatted and aligned. E-MAIL AND VIDEO COORDINATOR

We began utilizing Constant Contact three years ago. For those not familiar with Constant Contact, it is a third-party application that allows the sending of bulk email. Judy / KC7KPG, for ions and ions, labored with increasing volumes of email needing to be sent to our members. Dealing with this growing amount of email necessitated segmenting the System's email list as her personal email account refused a bulk send. Sending notices concerning System events and other pertinent information became a laborious and time-consuming event for Judy. Her tireless devotion to the System can never be said loudly enough.

We currently have 1615 members in the Constant Contact database. This database is kept current with the Treasurer's database with regards to current dues status, call sign and email changes.

Through Constant Contact a member current with their dues receives the System's monthly newsletter, *The Communicator*. This follows the pay wall on the website. Supporting the System though dues has its perks!! Non-current members receive all other notices.

Constant Contact also affords easy communication with Period coordinators and controls. System control schedules are sent when changes occur.

The Voice, our yearly publication, is available via email or hardcopy to members current on their dues. The evolution of delivery is now greater through email, as demonstrated with the 2019-2020 edition, amounting to 403 being sent. Included with *The Voice* are an election ballot, convention information with registration form, and a dues renewal form. As you can see, that is a mass of paper no longer being sent through the Post Office.

In the past, if a member was not current on their dues, they did not receive their dues renewal form. With Constant Contact, dues renewals are sent twice a year to those not current. Dues defray the cost of the Website and Constant Contact, and most importantly, provides for the Scholarship fund.



Constant Contact is one more tool in our kitbag to keep our YL System family informed and connected.

FACEBOOK

This is an outline of what I attempted to do as Facebook Coordinator:

I vetted people wanting to join the group by attempting to determine if they were hams or working to obtain an amateur license. I also looked into other groups they belong to. If they had no obvious connection to ham radio and belonged to a large number of groups, I usually declined their attempt to join us to reduce the trolls making comments.

I also made an effort to cull older posts that either had newer posts as updates, were for events that had already passed, or had been posted for an extended period of time with no lasting value, judgement call, to the System. I also deleted death notices that had been posted for usually over a year.

All of these actions were taken to try and keep the YL System Facebook pages interesting for newbies and old timers alike without a lot of obsolete posts cluttering the group's page.

I suggest that when my replacement is appointed, she have at least one and possibly two other admins so a closer watch can be kept on the page, as one person may not happen to catch a proposed new member. Add to that it would be nice to have someone to discuss new proposed member assessment and post deletions that are questionable such as death notices. Perhaps a policy on death notices would be a good idea such as removal after three months.

HISTORIAN REPORT

Considerable time has been spent during the last year attempting to organizing YLISSB historical materials. This has included many of the SSB's Voices dating from 1964 to the present, CDs of YLISSB conventions, convention pictures, trophies/awards and other assorted items of historical significance. The purpose of this is to ensure that information can be obtained if and when needed and while preserving the history.

During this same time, I have also begun the process of reviewing and gleaming historical information that might help current members of the YLISSB better understand the background of the system. This historical background is what has made the YLISSB what it is today. It is important that we not lose site of the basis for starting the System or its original purpose.

I'm sure we all have been asked at one time or another what the YL System is or why we belong to a YL net (especially OMs). Many of our members know that our organization was started by a YL in the early 1960s. While that is a good start, it doesn't reflect the broader legacy of our System or its founder (V. Mayree).

Passage of time and advancing technology has made the System's initial purpose of emergency communication less central as many other communication options have evolved. Consequently, it is imperative for us to continually communicate this information and how we differ from other ham radio groups. Beginning the first of this year I have begun publishing a monthly article for the Communicator entitled, "YLISSB – Tracing our History". The primary purpose of this article is to review the many significant elements of our history that have resulted in our nearly 60 years of existence and well over 17,000 members.

As opportunities have arisen, either on the air or personally, I have attempted to briefly explain the background of our System and why we are known as a system rather than a net. This has resulted in greater awareness of the System and potential interest in participation. This always includes an invitation for them to visit our website for more details about our history and other information.

During the last year I have also served as a historical resource. On several occasions I have been asked to check on or recover historical information about the System. As mentioned previously, this is why organizing our historical documents has become so important to our current needs.



Finally, I have continued to request historical information from our members. Several months back a personal letter was sent out to about 12-15 long-term members of the System asking for their personal recollection of the early System and any interaction they may have had with our foundress (V. Mayree). Unfortunately, this has not yet resulted in much response. However, this effort is still in process with hopes of generating more valuable information.

INFORMATION OFFICER REPORT

The most important job of the Information Officer is the YLSystem member database, containing information on over 17780 members; Active, Inactive, and Silent Key. The database allows us to sort the members many different ways and determine statistics as to each of the categories. Currently (as of April 30, 2020) we have over 6000 members, with 538 paid-up members.

Of the 6014 members we find the following:

Not Known	260 members (Older Members Mostly Europe)

I have a distribution list of YLISSB officers to which I email copies of the database as needed. I can email a copy to anyone who requests it.



The information is used to prepare the following for the annual publication of the Voice: Membership Lists – US and DX, Devotionals, DKNA holders, Teams, North Star Award holders, USA Award holders, TFO and TFO trophy lists, Call Sign Changes, Expired Callsigns, Silent Keys, Rigel Trophy Holders, the “Special Awards” lists – Founders, Silent Service, Cornerstone and Ambassador Awards.

So far in the past 12 months we have recruited 214 new members, compared to 153 for the previous year.

NETLOGGER REPORT

Netlogger version 3.1.7 is currently up and stable. It is available for Windows (W), Apple (M), and Linux (L). Information on downloading and operating the Netlogger program can be found on our website: www.YLSystem.org, or just Google: www.Netlogger.org.

As the Netlogger Manager I maintain the Netlogger Database for the YLSystem. Each new member's data is entered into the database on the day they become a member. Each visitor's information is entered when they check in.

Each Netlogger Operator should download the latest club profile when they bring up Netlogger or take over Netlogger from another operator at the change of shift. Failing to do so will not guarantee having the current data. The last Netlogger operator for each session (i.e. Sunrise, 1st Period, Moonbeam, etc.) should be sure to close the logger. Leaving a session open on Netlogger may cause server problems. Also, any operator leaving a session before the session is closed should click on stop logging before leaving. Leaving while logging can cause serious problems for the operators still logging.

As of May 1, 2020, all Control operators will be required to log their own check-ins. This means they need to be very familiar with Netlogger operations and the consequences of entering information incorrectly. YL SYSTEM OUTREACH PROGRAM

PURPOSE

To provide our members (and their survivors) with an outlet to repurpose unneeded ham radio equipment in a way that benefits others.

BACKGROUND

We often hear of ham radio operators and clubs that have been asked to help dispose of ham radio equipment left by departed hams. We also hear of hams, including our members, who have been forced off the air by fires, floods, hurricanes, and other natural disasters. Then, too, there are also many radio clubs,

Scout troops, and individual young people who would be glad to receive a repurposed ham radio station to help them get started in our hobby.

The purpose of this proposal is to bring all of the above together in an YL Outreach Program for the benefit of all.

ACTION

YL members would be polled to see if they are interested in donating their ham radio equipment to the Outreach Program when they pass, or are unable to enjoy the hobby any longer. A sample letter stating their wishes would be provided for interested members to include with their will, and they would be encouraged to discuss their desire to donate their equipment with their survivors.

When a member passes, the YL System Outreach Program Coordinator would contact the family and ask if they are still willing to participate. If so, a nearby member would be asked to handle gathering up their equipment such as transceivers, amps, tuners, keys, antennas, etc. and shipping it to the Outreach Coordinator. They could also provide a "Fair Market Value" statement for the donated equipment for tax purposes.

The Outreach Coordinator would then repackage the donated equipment into basic "ham stations" consisting of a transceiver, amp, tuner, antenna, key, and cabling, and download equipment manuals, as needed to complete each package.

When a request is received from a distressed member, a local radio club, Scout troop, or others for a station, The Outreach Coordinator would ship off the station-in-a-box, and, if needed, contact a YL member in the recipient's vicinity to help get the station on the air.

In addition to the equipment, a one-year membership to the YL System and to the ARRL could also be provided in the case of a new ham.

SUMMARY

This program could be a "win-win" for all concerned. Our hobby can be just too expensive for young people to get started, or too expensive for someone on a fixed income to get back on the air after a natural disaster. If implemented, this program would help everyone - our members, our survivors, our organization, and (most importantly) the future of ham radio.

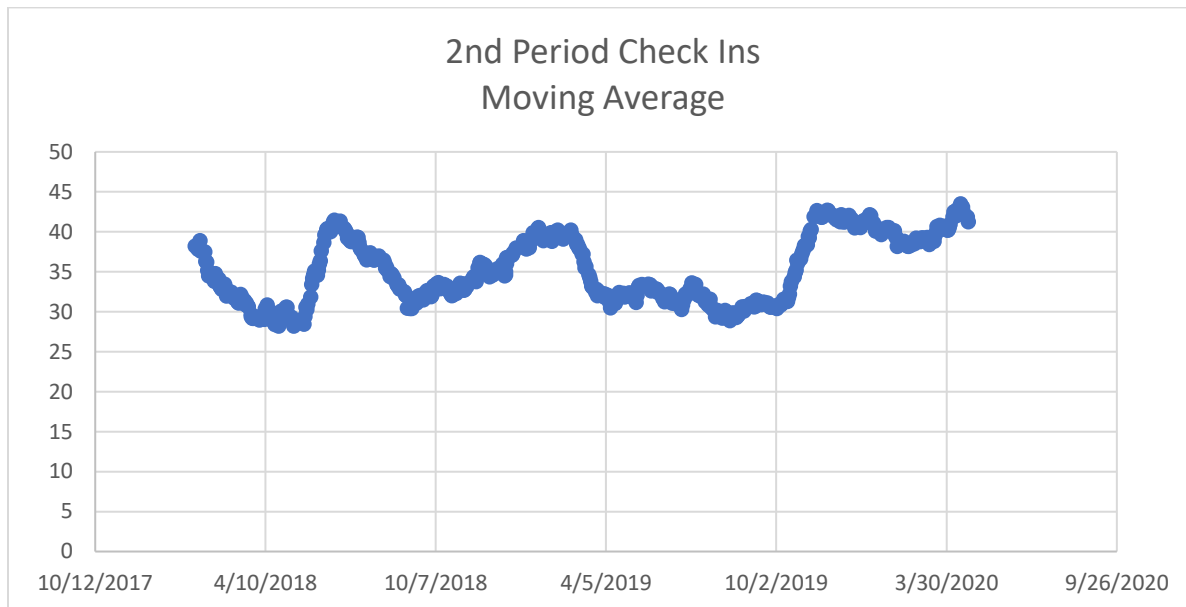

SECOND PERIOD REPORT

The YL System 2nd Period ran with four regular control stations except for the rare occasions when a control operator was unavailable for various personal reasons. The regular control stations were John KE7VSC in Oregon, Larry N5LEC in Arkansas, Dan K2DJL in New Jersey and Al AF5VH, the coordinator in New Mexico. As coordinator, I gratefully acknowledge the competence, reliability, dedication and all-around good humor of the three regular control operators. There was not a single incidence in the past year when a control failed to report in as expected. They make the coordinator's job easy and a pleasure.

During the past year 2nd period operated for about 255 sessions. We did not operate on the major holidays of the year. I collected check in logs on 241 of those sessions. In those sessions we had 8753 total check-ins for an average of just over 36 per session. Of those, approximately 73% were members, 17% were guests and 9% were first time check-ins. The division of members, guests, etc. are very similar for the earlier years for which I have data. One interesting effect that we have noticed is that on days where band conditions are very poor, check-ins are nearly all from member stations. The following graph shows a moving average of 2nd period check-ins for the last several years.



There are obvious seasonal variations in the number of check-ins per session. It does seem that the isolation associated with the current virus epidemic has increased the number of check-ins in recent months but that effect is not as strong as the past seasonal variations. I do not know if the seasonal variations are caused by changes in propagation, some other effect in the world of ham radio operators or a combination of those. Sadly, there is no indication of improved propagation that can be associated with the solar sunspot cycle.

The requirement for each control to be able to use Netlogger, has caused some concern and anguish among controls, but I think it is a positive step toward making each period move smoothly. We all tend to want things to always continue the way we are accustomed, and we very often don't like change. Change overtakes us in everything we do, and we hopefully find better ways to do things when that happens.

I'm proud to be associated with the third period and hope each of us can continue to give of our time and effort to keep things running as smoothly as possible.

10, 15, 40 AND 80 REPORT

Scientists charged with predicting the Sun's activity for the next 11-year solar cycle say the current solar cycle, Cycle 25 is forecasted to be below average, similar to Solar Cycle 24 last 2 years. This will continue to be a challenge for 2020-2021 for all ham operators and our sessions.

10 METERS (NOT SCHEDULED)

The 10 meter session was "disbanded" for a while due to extremely poor propagation. I am currently monitoring conditions for improvement. Propagation charts indicate isolated favor for North America and South America between 21:00-22:00 UTC. When overall propagation for the 10M band improves, I will look for volunteers.

17M METERS SUNDAY (3PM EST)

The move to 17 meters, 18.138, has provided a good result on the number for check-ins. From the middle of Jan to the middle of April the average number of check-ins is 20.6. The majority of those checking in are guests. So, it is a great frequency to introduce amateurs to the YL System. During that time span the following have participated as control: W1IZZ Larry, KN4QKS Jim, KR0ARK Roark and W7TOA Art. Drop in on Sunday afternoon / morning to join in on the fun.

40 METERS EAST (7PM EST)

The 40 meter EC session has been consistently popular. We are consistently logging between 20-30 check-ins in the hour session. Since we have moved the frequency to 7.245 we seemed to have established our presence for that frequency although occasionally either because of preceding QSO or interference from nearby frequencies requires us to move. 7.238 is often the alternate.

40 METERS WEST (10PM EST)

The 40 meter WC session has steadily grown in popularity for western part of the country as the 40M band wakes up later there. It's not uncommon for the session to run over the hour slot to accommodate stations standing by to check-in. KX9KX (Tom) assists in coordinating that session and is often the primary controller. Propagation usually supports coverage to the Midwest and East Coast on a good night with as many as 20-30 check-ins for the hour session.

75/80 METERS (MON 8PM EST)

The 75/80M band has become very crowded and often we have to search for adjacent frequency to respect other operators. We average 10-15 check-ins per session mostly dependent on band conditions. 80M propagation seem to favor contacts in the Northeast and Midwest, but with the help of relay stations we are more frequently logging stations in the Rocky Mountain states and the West Coast.

Thanks to all the controllers, assistants and relays. We have many new controllers and assistant controllers that all help make this system work. But... there is a need for more trained net controllers as scheduled



NCS, and/or to be a relief NCS when scheduled NCS are unavailable. It's been difficult to find enough volunteers to be responsible for starting the various sessions or to be included on a regular schedule. Once a session is started, we have plenty of help and relays but the inevitable last-minute weather or personal event it is sometimes difficult to find coverage.

2020 YLISSB CONVENTION -- BOARD MEETING MINUTES

June 14, 2020
(Via Zoom.com)

The YLISSB Board meeting was called to order at 4:00 (EDT) by President Rose Rybachek (KL7FQQ). Rose (KL7FQQ) requested Larry (AB3TY) to call roll of the Board.

Roll Call: Larry Kaplan (AB3TY) conducted a roll call of the Board. Present were: Rose Rybachek (KL7FQQ), Gloria Wells (K4DXM), Bill Phillips (W7AJP), Bruce Tisdale (K9ICP), Bob Percefull (NC4RP), Elsie Janes (N0ESJ), Gale Moody (KK4DYI), Larry Kaplan (AB3TY), and Bobbie Livingston (K4ZGH). A total of 34 members including the Board were in attendance (list of attendees attached).

Invocation: Bill Phillips (W7AJP) offered the invocation.

2019 Minutes: Rose (KL7FQQ) asked if the Board had any questions or correction to the 2019 Board minutes as distributed. Bruce (K9ICP) indicated a typo in the spelling of Gale's name which will be corrected. There being no further comments or corrects, Elsie Janes (N0ESJ) **moved** for approval of the minutes, **seconded** by Larry Kaplan, motion **passed**.

Old Business:

Special Day Awards: It was agreed, at the General meeting, to again start Special Day awards effective January 2021. This was **moved** by Elsie (N0ESJ) and **seconded** by Larry (AB3TY), motion **passed**.

Report on Convention Survey: Larry (AB3TY) indicated that the survey results, which were distributed with the packet, did not reflect anything unexpected. Larry (AB3TY) noted the primary reason that members don't attend a convention are distance and expense. There were no further comments or action taken on this information.

Control training video (attached letter): Rose (KL7FQQ) pointed out the letter from Shelby Cooper (AG5GP) attached to the packet in response to creating a training video. Shelby (AG5PG) indicated that he did not have the means to produce a video. Larry (AB3TY) pointed out that our Zoom agreement does not allow doing Webinars for this purpose. However, Larry (AB3TY) noted that we could still try to make a video. Several other suggestions and comments were offered including: one to one training, creating a training support team, have a class during the next convention, live demonstration on Zoom or Skype and establishing a test log for practice. It was agreed that no action on this would be taken right now.

Description of role regarding Constant Contact: The item was already covered during the General meeting.

Should the TFO program be abolished or overhauled: Rose (KL7FQQ) indicated that when the original TFO program started V. Maree identified and awarded all TFOs. Later this was changed to the current approach which requires 10 votes from existing TFO holders. However, recently this approach has not worked well. Elsie Janes (N0ESJ) indicated that many candidates get close to qualifying, but never get the needed 10 votes. Several recommendations were offered in response: Terry Clay (K5SSL) suggested lowering the qualifier to 5 votes; Bruce Tisdale (K9ICP) suggested leaving the automatic qualifier at 10, but a lower threshold (maybe 5-8 votes) that would allow an officer/committee to authorize approval. Following some further discussion Rose (KL7FQQ) suggested creating a committee of five existing TFO holders, who would recommend and approve future TFOs. This group would need to be anonymous to preserve its credibility. This change was **moved** by Gale Moody (KK4DYI), **seconded** by Bruce Tisdale (K9ICP), however **tabled** until the July Board meeting for further development.

Refund money from Scholarship fund regarding plaques: Rose (KL7FQQ) indicated that at the convention auction last year, several members donated toward obtaining a YLISSB plaque. The individual making these plaques was unable to fulfill this commitment. It was recommended by Rose that a refund of \$60.00 be offered to those members out of the scholarship fund. Members effected were Bruce Tisdale (K9ICP), Bob

Percefull (NC4RP), Bill Phillips (W7AJP), and Dennis Cornell (KL7HRO). Bruce, Bill, and Bob all declined the refund. Bill will arrange for the refund to Dennis (KL7HRO).

Bill (W7AJP) **moved** for the refund plan above, **seconded** by Bruce (K9ICP), motion passed.

Other: No further items offered

New Business:

Need to update Policy and Procedure Manual: Rose (KL7FQQ) indicated that the current Policy and Procedure Manual was in need of updating again. Rose (KL7FQQ) will work on this, but suggested a committee to help. The following individuals offered to support in this project: Nancy (K0YL), Bob (NC4RP), Bruce (K9CIP), and Anne Zuckerman (KC3EYB).

Other: Bill would like to transfer the balance of funds after convention expenses to the Scholarship fund. He has about \$1,300 in hand. He indicated that \$700 of that is from the convention account. There are expenses for Zoom (\$158), door prizes (\$105), and Dennis refund (\$60). There may be some other miscellaneous expense.

He would like the remaining balance to be placed in Scholarship. **No action required.**

Follow up issues from General meeting: Rose (KL7FQQ) noted that there were several follow up issues from the General meeting and comments made in Chat. These included the following: 1) Doing a Special Event station – this was addressed through reinstating the daily awards (K4ICA); 2) System name tags not on web site – Bob (NC4RP) will follow-up on this; 3) having a special Zoom meeting for new members – no action now; 4) establishing a YL only award – Elsie will develop; 5) have more than one Zoom meeting during the year – (possibly a theme, social meeting, or launch of K4ICA program) – a committee of Larry (AB3TY) Bill (W7AJP) and Bob (NC4RP) will consider and follow up recommendation for the board, 6) Bruce (K9ICP) recommended that Zoom conferencing be included in future conventions. This seemed to allow many more members to attend and addressed some issues identified in our convention survey mentioned earlier. Larry (AB3TY) indicated that he wasn't opposed to the idea, but pointed out the many logistic issues that needed to be addressed (i.e., only paid up members attend the convention, sending out notice of the convention and logging information, and other individual technical issues). The recommendation was **moved** by Bruce (K9ICP), **seconded** by Bob (NC4RP), motion **passed**. 7) coordinator for operations on 17-meters. Terry Clay (K5SSL) has provided support for 17-meter operation in the past. Larry **moved** that Terry be made the 17-Meter Coordinator. Terry has agreed to accept this role. It was **seconded** by Bob Percefull (NC4RP), motion **passed**. 7) Bob (NC4RP) asked if it was possible to reflect paid membership on Net logger – Larry (AB3TY) noted this should be discussed at next Board meeting, and 8) Shelby Cooper (AG5GP) suggested that we consider having periodic regional conferences. He will investigate this further.

Swear in new officers: Bill Phillips (W7AJP) offered some preliminary comments regarding the responsibilities and expectations for the new officers. The new officers were asked to repeat after Bill their commitment to these roles. The following individuals were sworn in: Rose Rybachek (KL7FQQ) – President; Nancy Yoshida (K0YL) – Vice President; Bob Percefull (NC4RP) – Treasurer; Jim (KN4QKS) – Assistant Treasurer, and Larry Kaplan (AB3TY) – Board.

Adjourn: Rose closed the meeting at 5:30 pm (EDT). Nancy Yoshida **moved** for adjournment, **seconded** by Bob Percefull (NC4RP), motion **passed**.

Article VII – Section 3. (THE YLISSB MAY HOLD AN ANNUAL QSO PARTY IF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS DEEM IT PRUDENT). IF A QSO PARTY IS HELD, IT SHOULD) ~~The YLISSB annual QSO party will~~ be held during the first six (6) months of the year, dates to be announced in YLISSB VOICE newsletter, (ON THE WEB SITE) and other amateur radio publication in advance.

Article VIX – Membership – Section (e)Inactive members, being those that are not current with dues, shall be extended the rights and privileges of full membership, but shall not be eligible to vote, participate in formal business, apply for awards or scholarships, (ACCESS THE FULL WEB-SITE), hold office within the organization, or receive the annual (OR MONTHLY) publications.

Article XI – PUBLICATIONS – Section 2, (a) The COMMUNICATOR will be free to all (ACTIVE) members on-line.

Article XI – PUBLICATIONS – Section 3, the YLISSB shall provide a web site for its members. Access to the Web site shall be free to all (ACTIVE) members.

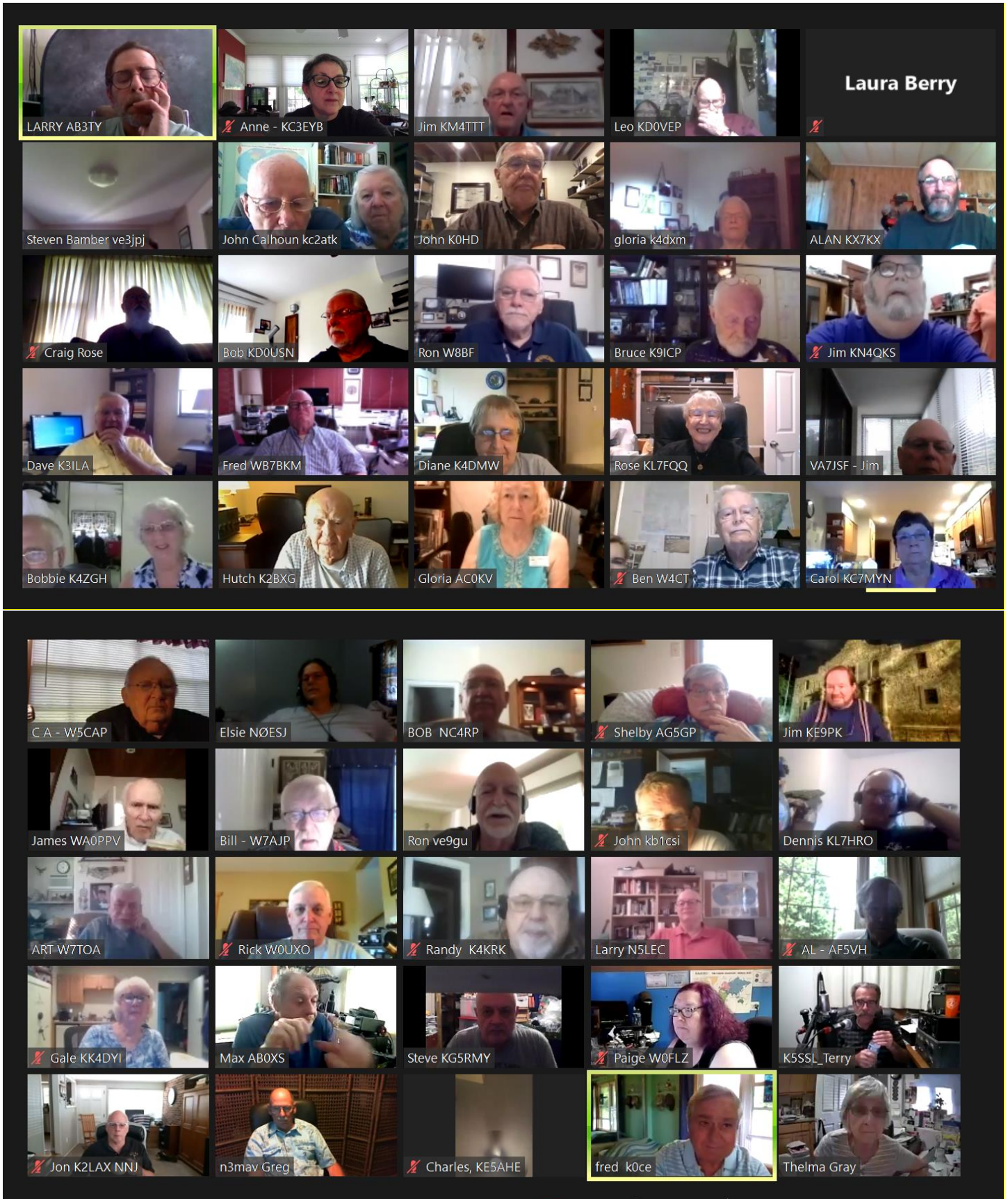

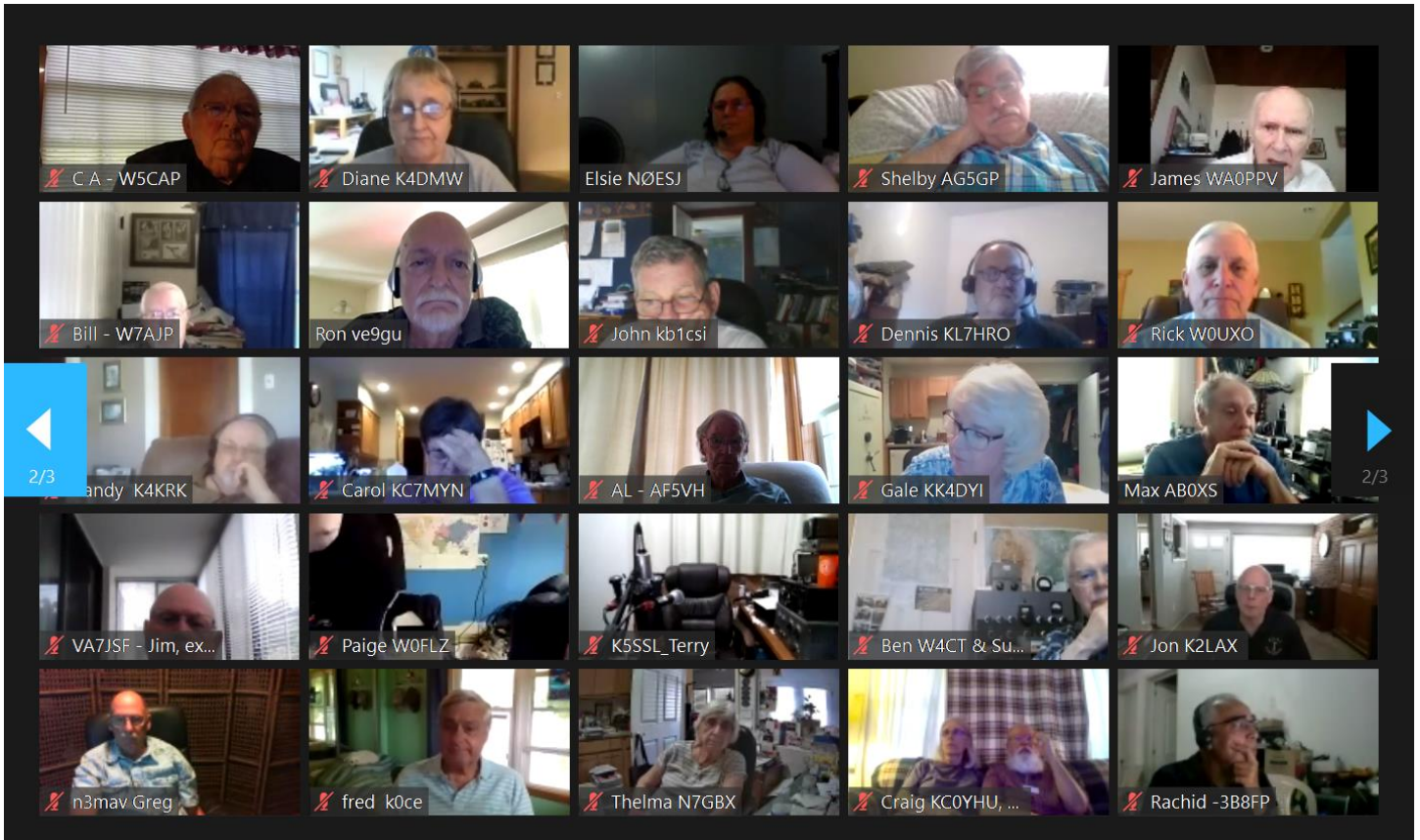

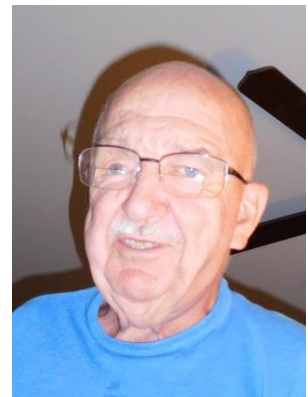

- 2. Each award is administered by an Award Manager. Upon completion of your application, send it, and any fee, to the appropriate manager.
- 3. Print as clearly as possible, so that there will be no question as to your meaning of an entry. PLEASE!!!
Use only one side of the paper and put your call on the top of each page.
- 4. Make fees payable to the appropriate Award Manager.
- 5. Award Managers will NOT facilitate any request requiring research of prior certificates, or numbers. Once issued, it is also each member’s own responsibility to maintain records for future application of awards requiring the submission of certificate dates, and numbers – such as the Pegasus.
- 6. All Awards may be completed on any band or combination of bands during regular session(s) of the YLISSB, unless the particular award requires that it be competed on a specific band or session of the YLISSB. A member station may be used only once for an award unless the award rules specifically state otherwise.

All awards may again be completed for almost any endorsement that you may desire. These may include all YL, all OM, all VW Beetle mobile, all XYL, or multi-band. The potential is virtually endless.

- 7. If you have earned a specific award for which your call sign should be listed in the annual copy of the VOICE, and your call is NOT listed, it is your responsibility to notify the respective award manager.
- 8. After many changes of managers, over more than a 50-year history of our organization, things do get lost, or inadvertently missed. If you say you have a certificate, which is not listed, send the information to the current Award Coordinator, or the current President, for inclusion in the next issue of the Voice.
- 9. The Pegasus award represents the level of achievement on the part of a member requiring a very significant effort. It takes 1500 points, earned from a combined score of individual awards, and plaques, to qualify for “The Pegasus”. The number of points earned for each award are shown as a parenthetical notation immediately following each awards title.

Start date August 1, 2006 Contact 5 member stations, each in a different country of Asia.

ALL STATES – (5) **Fee - \$5.00 US each** – Start date January 20, 1969

This program consists of 50 separate certificates. Each State Award is achieved by contacting 10 Member stations in that State. This fee includes a certificate and the cost of a plaque upon completion of all 50 State certificates.

EXCEPTION: **Fee - \$1.00 US each**

IF you DO NOT want the certificate, but just want a Number issued for record this fee will apply. This will count only for record. If you later desire to obtain the plaque, the cost of a plaque will be required at that time. By rendering the \$5.00 for each State Certificate, you are at that time covering the future cost of a plaque upon completing all 50 State certificates.

AMBASSADOR CORPS AWARD – (15) **Fee - \$5.00 US** Start date January 1, 2021.

Issued for contacting 14 Ambassador Corps members plus one Ambassador Extraordinaire. Contacts may be made on any combination of System frequencies or modes. All contacts must be made without assistance.

APOLLO – (10) **Fee - \$5.00 US** Start date August 1, 2006

Contact holders of the TFO Certificate, the TFO Trophy, or The Rigel Trophy. A total of 100 points is needed for this certificate. Additional certificates may be earned – but no call or number may be repeated.

POINT SYSTEM: 1 Point for a TFO Certificate Holder
 5 Points for a Trophy Holder
 10 Points for Holder of Both Trophies
 11 Points for TFO and Both Trophies

ARTA – (10) – AMATEUR RADIO TEAM AWARD - **Fee - \$5.00 US**

Start date February 9, 1963 - Contact 25 member teams. A team consists of a husband & wife, brother & sister, mother & son, father & daughter. Upon completing this award 4 times totaling 100 different teams, you become eligible for an ARTA plaque. Costs of an ARTA Plaque will be determined at the time of the application.

AUTUMN AWARD (10) **Fee - \$5.00 US** Start date September 1, 2006

This award is earned by working any 50 members during the Second and Third daily periods and ONLY during the months of September, October, and November.

BELT OF ORION (10) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date – Annually as of January 1st – Starting 2020

Three new call signs will be added each year and three will be removed each year to insure currency and provide new operating challenge.

Contact 10 of the following 12 members.

BIG RIG MOBILE (25) Fee - \$5.00 US Start Date: August 1, 2009

Issued for contacting member stations, that are mobile, in a “BIG RIG” per DOT weight class of 26,001 pounds or more and intended for Commercial Interstate transit, within the lower 48 States.

If a member is physically driving a Commercial Vehicle, that is considered a single unit vehicle – with a minimum of 10 tires on the pavement, and in Commercial transit across State lines, this vehicle may also be accepted for credit.

In the event that there may be a member, who is also in the U.S. Armed Forces, but also driving a vehicle that meets the requirements of a Military Heavy Transport Vehicle, this too would be acceptable.

In that this award has in the past been intended for the “lower 48”, it is also possible to get a certificate for the 49th and 50th State - after getting the required “Lower” 48 State certificate. Work them - save them - for the other 48 to be completed.

Thus, this means that one might be able to get 3 Mobile WAS certificates while working the 50 individual States.

CANADIAN RHAPSODY (10) Start date: January 1, 1990, Fee - \$5.00 US

Contact a member station from each of the Canadian Provinces and may also be the same member when mobile or portable.

Contacts may be on any band, any mode.

CENTURY (50) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date January 1, 1992

The initial award is issued for working a mix of YL / OM members with membership numbers ending with 00 through 99 – equaling a total of 100 contacts. Even though beginning is acceptable at any

time, the 100 contacts must be within the same calendar year. Should you not complete the 100 required contact within the year, you have the challenge of beginning again on January 1st.

Additional categories have no time limit, and are completed without having to start over, each January 1st. By using the same concept of 00 through 99, there are 3 additional endorsements available:

Category 2 --	All YL	Note: USE A SEPARATE	
Category 3 --	All OM	SHEET FOR EACH	
Category 4 --	All TFO	CATEGORY	

If a contact applies to more than one category, it is acceptable to apply that contact in each category that the requirement is met.

CONTINENTAL AWARD (25) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date January 1, 2018

Contact member stations in the 48 continental states (excluding AK and HI), plus the Canadian Provinces (excluding the Canadian Territories). This award may be earned by combining contacts on all bands during regular sessions of the YLISSB, or a separate award for each band. Additional endorsements in the form of stickers may be earned by contacting a member station in Alaska and/or Hawaii. You may only use one member contact from each state.

DEVOTIONAL (25) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date January 1, 1969.

This award is issued for working 50 member stations of the Clergy. The Clergy is not limited to any denomination, faith or religion. Typical Clergy is defined as anyone dedicated to full, part time, or interim work with a congregation, denomination, or a person who has completed Seminary or other Religious School training. It could include a Minister, Priest, Rabbi, Nun, Missionary, Seminary Teacher. Any member who is retired from any of the above listings would also qualify as Clergy.

The individual member is the final determination as to whether or not they are a Devotional. There is no specific criteria that specifically qualifies anyone.

EYEBALL FELLOWSHIP AWARD (5) Fee \$5.00 US: Effective January 1, 2017

Within a 12 month period, personally meet members of the System that live at least 50 miles from your home QTH. Contacts made at any Convention are not eligible for this award. The award can be repeated annually, or all three levels can be earned in a 12-month period. The levels of the award are:

Level 1 – (5)	Meet Three (3) Members
Level 2 – (5)	Meet Six (6) Members
Level 3 – (5)	Meet Ten (10) Members

EUROPE (5) Fee - \$5.00 US - Start date August 1, 2006

Contact 5 member stations, each in a different country of Europe.

FULL HOUSE 100 (10) Fee - \$5.00 US Beginning April 1, 1994

This award is issued for working 100 YL or OM members, and using their respective membership and TFO number to make up a "Full House" poker hand. This award has 4 endorsements – each requiring 100 contacts after the original certificate is issued.

EXAMPLES: Member # 9571 and TFO # 171 = 3 #1 and 2 # 7
or "Full House" hand of 7-7-1-1-1

Member # 10600 and TFO # 180 = 4 # 0 and 2 # 1
Discard a 0 for "Full House" hand 3 # 0's and 2 # 1's

FULL HOUSE 50 (10) - Fee - \$5.00 US Beginning January 1, 2018

This award is issued for working 50 YL or OM members, and using their respective membership and TFO number to make up a "Full House" poker hand. This award has 4 endorsements – each requiring 50 contacts after the original certificate is issued.

EXAMPLES: Member # 9571 and TFO # 171 = 3 #1 and 2 # 7
or "Full House" hand of 7-7-1-1-1

GLOBAL (50) Fee - \$5.00 US Beginning September 1, 1996.

This award takes 12 months to complete. Contacts are made with members on a monthly basis – not calendar year basis. A total of 30 contacts are needed for each month in the following categories:

12 TFO
12 OLD TIMERS with # below 16,700
3 DX MEMBERS
3 NEW MEMBERS with a # above 17,550

The NEW MEMBER number will be adjusted annually and listed on the web site, in the "Communicator", and the System's "VOICE". However, the number will

NEVER be more than the latest 300 membership numbers.

GOLDEN FIRESIDE (25) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date January 1, 1980.

Issued for contacting a YLISSB team in all 50 States. Both must have a member number AND both must make their own contact and exchange reports without assistance.

Contacts may be on any combination of System frequencies or modes. Contacts off System frequencies during the annual QSO Party are acceptable.

GOLDEN SEXTANT (25) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date January 1, 1978.

Issued for working 10 members on any one continent other than your own.

KING NEPTUNE (15) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date January 1, 1975.

Issued for working a total of 30 contacts – 15 US and 15 DX.

Multiple certificates may be earned, each worth 15 points, with NO repeat contacts from prior certificates.

LOUISIANA PURCHASE AWARD (5) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date January 1, 2017.

During any calendar month, contact member stations in each of 15 states or Canadian Territories included in whole or part of the Louisiana Purchase.

The purchased territory included the whole of today's Arkansas, Iowa, Missouri, Kansas, Oklahoma, and Nebraska, parts of Minnesota and Louisiana west of Mississippi River, including New Orleans, big parts of North Colorado as well as portions of Canadian Provinces of Alberta and Saskatchewan.

The territory contained land that forms Arkansas, Missouri, Iowa, Oklahoma, Kansas, and Nebraska; the portion of Minnesota west of the Mississippi River, a large portion of North Dakota; a large portion of South Dakota; the northeastern section of New Mexico; the northern portion of Texas; the area of Montana, Wyoming, and Colorado east of the Continental Divide, Louisiana west of the Mississippi River and small portions of land within the present Canadian provinces of Alberta and Saskatchewan.

MAPLE LEAF (10) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date January 1, 1990.

Issued for contacting numbers of members in the following Canadian Call Areas:

Contacts are to be made on System frequencies. Any band that is operating with a control station is acceptable and mixed bands are permitted.

MOBILE (25) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date January 1, 1980.

Issued for contacting members either fixed or mobile in each of the 50 States in their appropriate category.

Category 1: Fixed stations contact 2 mobile stations in each of the 50 States.

Category 2: Mobile to Mobile contact 1 member in each of the 50 States.

A new certificate may be issued for a new category or a seal may be requested to add to the original certificate.

A fee would apply to a second or third certificate, but seals are available for an SASE.

NOTE: Each category completed awards an additional 25 points. If a team is mobile – for each to be counted

MOONBEAM SERVICE (25) Fee - NONE Start date August 1, 2006

This award will be issued for a minimum of 100 hours as a control station operator during the Moonbeam Session of the System.

Each control should keep their own record of dates and hours worked. Submit this log to the Moonbeam Coordinator.

Certificates will be issued in 100 hour increments for a total of 10 certificates equaling 1000 hours. Completing all 10 certificates would equal a total of 250 points toward the awards program. Current members completing 1000 hours as a control will also receive 2 years - free dues.

MOONBEAM WORKED ALL CANADA (25) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date is August 1, 2006

This award is attained by working ONE member station in each of the 10 Canadian Provinces and 3 Territories during the Moonbeam portion of the System.

All contacts must be completed during active and controlled session of the Moonbeam Session.

Upon completion of the initial certificate, additional certificates may be earned, with special endorsements for all 50 State Capitols, WAS all YL, WAS all OM, and WAS all mobile, or a new, but different certificate, may be earned by completing the original requirements – but during a new calendar year.

NOTE: NO contacts from the original certificate may be used for additional certificates – you MUST work each State again.

ALSO, there is no time limit on certificates other than the original. Log extracts must include, as a minimum, Date, Time, Call Sign, State, and Membership Number. Other information is optional.

MOONBEAM WEEKEND WARRIOR AWARD (5) Fee - \$5.00 US: Effective January 1, 2018

Within a 12 month period, contact 52 system member stations during the weekend portion of the Moonbeam Session of the YL System. Contacts must be made on Saturday or Sunday. No station may be used more than one time for this award.

SPECIAL MOONBEAM WEEKEND WARRIOR AWARD (5) Fee - \$5.00 US: Effective JULY 1, 2019, AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2019

Within the 6 month period, contact 26 system member stations during the weekend portion of the Moonbeam Session of the YL System. Contacts must be made on Saturday or Sunday. No station may be used more than one time for this award. Contacts made for this award will not carry forward to the Moonbeam Weekend Warrior Award that will begin on January 1, 2019.

NEW MEMBERS Fee - \$5.00 US This certificate begins new as of January 1, each year.

This certificate will be offered for working 52 new members from the previous calendar year.

Options: (1) Work 52 new members on a single System Frequency.
(2) Work 52 new members on more than one System Frequency.

This gives options for several certificates. HOWEVER, once a new member is worked on one band, that is it! That call cannot be used again on another band.

NORTH STAR Fee - \$5.00 US Start date January 1, 1975.

Issued to a member station that has made contact with another member in the required number of countries.

This award will be point credit toward the Pegasus as follows:

Complete award, Class A only, received prior to August 1, 2006 - 100 Points.

Award received after August 1, 2006 as follows:

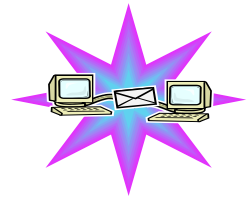

When a person that you welcome to the System becomes a member, you then can list that contact toward this certificate, and this award requires a minimum of 25 new members numbers for your certificate to be issued.

Upon completing this award 4 times, or 4 different certificate, with 4 different sets of numbers, and with a total of 100 new member numbers, you are then eligible for a Nova Plaque upon submitting those 4 certificate numbers to the Award Manager.

OLD TIMER (10) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date August 1, 2006

Issued for working a total of 25 members in each of the following numbered categories:

5 members with membership numbers under	12,700
5 members with membership numbers under	14,200

10 members with membership numbers under	16,200

NOTE: Each member and number may be used only once.

OVER WORKED-UNDER PAID (10) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date August 1, 2006

This award can NOT be earned by working any specific number of members or stations. It is obtained by a minimum of 2 other members submitting \$5.00 US to the award manager and recommending a member for the award. The funds generated by this award will become part of the fund that supports the System's Annual Scholarship Fund.

This award is NOT intended as a reward for any specific position or function. It is intended for recognition for a job well done that has required a significant effort over a period to time that has made a positive difference in the entire System.

PALINDROME AWARD (15) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date January 1, 2021

Issued for contacting 10 member stations whose callsign or YLISSB Number reads the same forward as backward. For instance, AB3BA or 16761. Contacts may be made on any band, but only one contact per member.

PRESIDENT'S SPECIAL SITUATION (10) Fee – NONE

This is intended as a means for the current President to initiate a one of a kind certificate – or initiate a new certificate until such time as it may be integrated into the Award Program.

SERVICE (25) NO CHARGE Start date August 1, 2009

Issued to Any YL System Scheduled Control Stations, and their assistants for 100 hours as a Control Station. You keep track of your individual times and then submit “your” record to the Award Manager. The initial certificate is issued for the first 100 hours. Additional certificates are available, for each additional 100 hours. The certificate set is complete when you have collected all 10 certificates, totaling 1000 hours. Members earning 1000 hours, with time beginning as of August 1, 2009, will be awarded 2 years of free dues This currently is valued at \$40.00.



SPRING AWARD (10) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date March 1, 2007

This award is earned by working any 50 members during the System’s Sunrise Portion and ONLY during the months of March, April, and May.

SPECIAL DAYS ON THE SYSTEM See the inside of the back cover.

SUMMER AWARD (10) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date June 1, 2007

This award is earned by working any 50 members beginning on during the System's First and Second daily periods and ONLY during the months of June, July, and August.

TFO CERTIFICATE (50) Fee NONE

This is not an award that an Individual member can achieve by working specific requirements. Each holder of the TFO Certificate is permitted to nominate, once a month – 12 times a year - and for 12 different potential new TFO members. Nominate your choice on the website.

This award is NOT intended to be a reward for any specific service - or duration of membership.

It is totally intended for the member that displays high standards as a Radio Amateur, by exhibiting above average operating practices. Upon attaining 10, or more votes, from 10 different, current paid-up members and holders of the TFO Certificate, a new certificate will be issued to the newly chosen Top Flight Operator.

NO MEMBER shall be eligible to receive votes for TFO with less than one year (12 Months) from their initial date of membership.

USA 10 METER (25) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date August 1, 2006

This award is attained by working a member in all 50 of the United States on the 28.573 MHz. System.

USA 15 METER (25) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date August 1, 2006

This award is attained by working a member in all 50 of the United States on the System's 21.373 MHz. System.

USA 20 METERS (25) Fee - \$5.00 US

Issued for working a member station in each of the 50 States on the System's 20 meter frequency of 14.332 MHz.

USA 40 METERS (25) Fee - \$5.00 US

This award is attained by working a member station from each of the 50 States on the System's 40 meter frequency of 7.245 or 7.254 MHz.

USA 80 METERS (25) Fee - \$5.00 US

This award is attained by working a member station from each of the 50 States on the System's 80 meter frequency of 3.932 MHz.

VETERAN AWARD (10,15, 20) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date August 1, 2012.

Issued for working members who are veterans of service in the US Military. This includes service while on active duty, reserve, and national guard. Any member who is currently on Active Duty, or has received an Honorable release is eligible to be counted. Just ask both ladies and gentlemen. Many have served.

This award is available for 25 – 50 – and 100 veterans worked. You can submit the fee for each level, or get a single certificate for 100.

VETERAN AWARD Part II: (10) Fee - \$5.00 US Start date August 1, 2012

Issued for working multiples of 25 – but these are veterans of foreign military service. (Canada – Barbados etc.)

All nations have military veterans, and this is a way that the System can show our respect to our DX members for their service also.

WINTER AWARD (10) Fee \$5.00 US Start date December 1, 2006

This award is earned by working any 50 members during the System's Moonbeam Session and ONLY during the months of December, January, and February.

25 YEAR CERTIFICATE (25) Fee – NONE Start date Your 25th Anniversary

as a YLISSB System Member. This certificate will be issued to any member requesting it, free of charge, for 25 years of membership. The last number issued for 1989 was 14,750.

The certificates will be issued once per month.

Example: A request received in January, will be issued on the FIRST DAY of February.

- MAY:** OLD TIMER'S AWARD 2021: Fee \$5.00 -- May 1 thru 31, 2021
Contact 30 members with a membership number below 16,500.
- JUNE:** CONVENTION AWARD 2021: Fee \$5.00 -- June 1 thru 30, 2021
Contact 20 members who reside in the State of Missouri. Convention attendees count during the days of the actual convention.
- JULY:** JULY INDEPENDENCE AWARD 2021: Fee \$5.00 -- July 1 thru 31, 2021

SECTION III: PLAQUES

ALL STATES: (50) When all 50 individual State certificates are collected, the holder may then apply for an All States 10 by 50 Plaque.

The cost of the plaque will be determined at the time of application, UNLESS the applicant rendered \$5.00 for each of the 50 certificates. If the \$5.00 fee was paid each time, the Plaque will be free to that person.

The All States Plaque will be worth an additional 50 points toward the Award Program in addition to the (5) points earned with each of the State Certificate.

CORNERSTONE: (50) Fee NONE

This is a Plaque represents EXCEPTIONAL recognition to a member for service rendered over an extended period of time that would have otherwise left the System's membership less informed – without a valuable service having been provided – or caused.

Without this member doing what they have done for an extended period of time - the System would not have evolved into the organization it is today.

This is not intended for doing something for a short period. It is meant to cover a minimum of 3 years.

This exceptional member would be in the 1 % group.

Any member may at any time submit information to the System Secretary with the name and call sign of a member that they feel meets these criteria. This very detailed presentation will then be discussed by the then governing officers and a decision made as to whether such an award will be issued. The member making the recommendation and the results will be kept in strict confidence at all times.

MOONBEAM: (50) Beginning February 9, 1980

This plaque is achieved ONLY for operation on 14.332 MHz.during the evening controlled Moonbeam portion of the System

It requires contact with 1000 different members. No credit will be allowed for calls from different locations – one call – one time only.

A member operating from a country with a prefix of a country other than their native residence is an exception. Example: 8P9 / K4ICA.

This plaque will be awarded at the time of application upon approval of all requirements by the Award Manager.

Any costs for this plaque will be determined at the time of application.

PEGASUS: As of August 1, 2006

This award will be the high point of achievement, for a very significant effort, on the part of a member. It takes 1500 points, earned from a combined score of individual awards, and plaques, to qualify for "The Pegasus".

Being that the Pegasus is the ultimate goal of the Award Program – there will be no point value – but a lot of serious bragging rights - well earned.

This is not a trophy, and really not a plaque. It is a tall and elegant acrylic creation that is etched in an impressive monumental type pillar.

The Pegasus will normally be presented at the Annual Convention.

The fee for the Pegasus will be determined at the time of application.

The PEGASUS is a Once in a Lifetime Award

RIGEL: (50) As of August 1, 2006

This award has been changed from a trophy to an individually designed plaque.

This award is granted on an annual basis as designated by the then governing members. It is intended as recognition for exceptional service by a member serving as a System Control on any or all of the System's controlled sessions.

The Rigel Plaque will normally be presented at the Annual Convention.

There is NO fee to be incurred by the member receiving this honor.

The RIGEL is a Once in a Lifetime Award

SILENT SERVICE AWARD: (100)

This award is presented by the then current members of the Board of Directors, with no specific begin date.

This award is for a member that "SILENTLY" performs a duty or service to the System that most members generally are not aware of.

The intent is to render recognition to those that have quietly and without recognition performed for an extended period of time, but never less than 3 years.

The initial award was a team award to Rex and Marilyn White, at the 2009 Convention in Washington State. As a team, Rex had been the Scholarship Fund Custodian, and Marilyn had overseen the operation of the Convention Boutique for well in excess of 10 years. Both instances, behind the scene, were very essential. Both were exceptional examples of "Silent Service".

There is NO requirement for this award to be an annual presentation. This is entirely up to the current Board of Directors.

TFO (Top Flight Operator) of the YEAR: (100)

As of August 1, 2006, this award has been changed from a trophy to an individually designed plaque.

TFO holders are encouraged to nominate their choice for the TFO of the Year Award by submitting their nomination on the Website. Any TFO holder can nominate a person they feel is a role model for what the Top Flight Operator (TFO) program is all about. The Board of Directors will have the final say on the issuance of the award.

The TFO of the Year Plaque will normally be presented at the Annual Convention. A Certificate will be presented at the time the award is announced.

There is NO fee to be incurred by the member receiving this honor.

Excluded are old calls, SK's, expired calls and cancelled numbers.

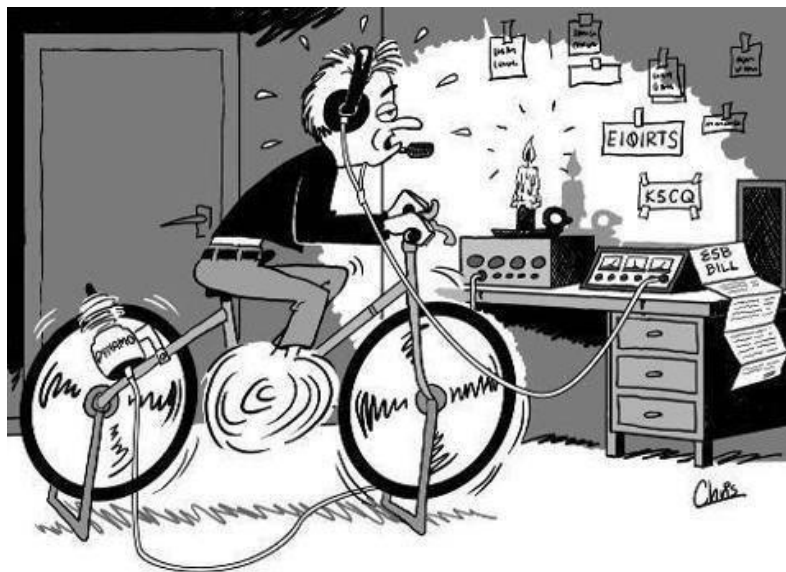
Only the most current calls are listed. Every effort has been made to remove old call signs from the lists.
